Decisions

Pass means has met learning outcomes of module

Passed after Second Attempt means did not pass the module at the first attempt but has passed after submission of a

second attempt

Passed after Repeat Assessment means did not pass the module at the first attempt but has passed after repeating the

module

Compensated Pass means did not meet the learning outcomes through assessment but judged to have met the

standard of the award due to strength of overall performance.

RPL Module

No mark, grade or decision is displayed for modules marked as "RPL". RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning) means that the student has met the necessary learning outcomes as a result of previous study or relevant experience.

Credits
